Illinois Organ/Tissue Donor Registry

By joining the registry, your wish to be an organ/tissue donor will be honored. Family consent is not required for those age 18 and older. Family consent is still required for those under age 18 and those not listed in the registry.

If you registered as a donor before January 2006, you must re-register.

Donation is not considered until all efforts to save a person's life have failed.

Acceptable organs include the heart, liver, lungs, kidneys, pancreas and intestines. Tissues include skin, bone. corneas, tendons, heart valves, saphenous veins, blood and bone marrow.

More than 25 people can benefit from a single donor.

All major religions support donation as a final, charitable act of giving to others.

A donor's family is never charged for the removal of organs, nor do they receive compensation.

Donor families may make any funeral/burial arrangements.

Consent to be a donor may be withdrawn at any time by notifying the Secretary of State's office.

Please include my name in the Illinois Organ/Tissue Donor Registry. I understand that by consenting to include my name in the registry, have given full legal authority for the donation of my organs and/or tissues upon my death.
