What is the SNS?

□ A national storage of medications & medical supplies for use in the event that a public health emergency is severe enough to cause local supplies to be depleted

□ Designed to supplement & replenish state and local public health agencies

More SNS info...

- □ Medication & supplies are free
- □ Enough medication & supplies to protect several large cities simultaneously
- □ Stockpiles are strategically located and are ready to deploy supplies within 12 hours (Push Packages)

SNS Background

 Originally established in 1999 as the National Pharmaceutical Stockpile (NPS) managed by HHS and CDC

■ March 2003 – became SNS and managed by HHS and DHS

SNS Assets

 Determined by current threats, material availability, ease of distribution, and medical vulnerability

☐ Inspected quarterly for quality assurance/control

Transport & Distribution of Supplies

- □ 12-hour Push Packages transported to receiving site by cargo plane or truck
- □ Supplies transferred to state & local authorities upon arrival at designated site
- □ Push Packages then broken down for distribution to local drop site
- □ Possible that supplies may be sent in multiple shipments depending on the size of the event

SNS Deployment

- Must be evidence of disease outbreak,
 biological or chemical incident, or a national emergency
- □ SNS assets are requested from an affected state's governor
- □ HHS, CDC, & other federal officials evaluate
 & determine the course of action

Examples of events that justify SNS Deployment

- □ CBRNE event
- Medical emergency brought on by natural disaster
- □ Information from intelligence or law enforcement

- Clinical, laboratory, or epidemiological indicators
- □ Unexplained increases in EMS requests
- □ Unexplained increase in prescriptions of medication use

SNS Request Procedure

- □ Hospital sends SNS request to LHD
- □ LHD forwards hospital request, along with its own request to local EMA
- □ Local EMA sends request to IEMA
- □ IEMA informs IDPH of request
- □ IDPH then determines what/how much to dispense
- □ Remember that an emergency declaration must be made before activation of the stockpile


Point of Dispensing Site


- □ Designated site for the distribution of SNS medication in the event of an emergency
- □ Generally operated by local health department staff & volunteers
- □ Public PODs for the general public
- □ Closed PODs for critical infrastructure personnel & their families (i.e. first responders, POD workers, large industry employees, etc.)

POD Operations


- □ Discuss sections of a POD
- □ Discuss POD layout at NMS: primary site
- Just-in-time training cards will be given for workers
- □ POD forms: Client medical form, Agent information form, and medication form
